Sommerro Oslo

Just as Nobis did for Copenhagen, Sommerro is about to do for Oslo: elevating an edgy Scandi-city to one of the coolest capitals in the northern hemisphere. After all, where one ludicrously well-designed boutique goes, more inevitably follow. Housed in the historic headquarters of the city's original electrical company, some spaces date back to 1870 while the whole place – particularly those Art Decoinspired suites – emanate a 1930s je ne sais quoi. Come September, you'll lounge in its rooftop pool (Oslo's first), wander around Frogner (the neighbourhood is popular with expats, drawn in by bougie design shops and some of the city's best-reviewed restaurants), and get down to the business in the woody, Wi-Fied meeting rooms.
